

TREE MAINTENANCE

Following discussion at last year's AGM, the Board commissioned Bartlett Tree Experts to carry out a comprehensive survey of all 50+ trees on our site. If you would like to know more about the condition of our trees and planned tree works you can view the Tree Survey in the members' area of the website.

The survey recommends works across a 3-year time-table. The cost of the first year's work was in excess of £2,000. In addition work has been carried out on hedge-cutting and herbicide treatment to deal with brambles and other hazards within the perimeter fencing. The total spending to date on tree care and related services is over £4000. Professional advice and follow-up does not come cheap!

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING AND VOLUNTEER OF THE YEAR AWARD
